

Kendall Central School Charge Policy – 2011/2012

Students:

1. When it is necessary to charge a breakfast or lunch the student may charge a standard school meal, complete with all selections.
2. Four is the maximum number of charges a student may owe. After four charges the account is locked and the student will receive a peanut butter/jelly sandwich and juice or milk (non-reimbursable meal).
3. Students are not allowed to purchase ala carte items if outstanding charges exist.
4. Cafeteria cashiers will give students with outstanding charges a note stating how much is owed.
5. If payment is not received after 2 attempts, the cafeteria manager will send a letter or email to the parent or call the parent informing them of how much is owed.
6. If no response is received after this and the child continues to come to school with no lunch or funds, the matter will be turned over to a school counselor or appropriate authority.
7. After Memorial Day there is no charging school wide.
8. If there remain outstanding charges after Memorial Day, the cafeteria manager will telephone, email or mail letters home to obtain payments.

Adults: No charging.
